<b>FOR RESPONSE</b>	<p><b>USER TRIALS SESSIONS – JANUARY 2016</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The e-counting supplier CGI, in partnership with IDOX, are in the process of establishing a Count Centre at Pentland House, Edinburgh to:<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>a) before Christmas, conduct a series of structured technical tests to demonstrate that the e-counting system for 2017 is fully compliant with the specification of requirements, and</li><li>b) early in the new year, allow authorities to familiarise themselves with the system. This will provide an opportunity to provide feedback which may lead to limited revisions to the supplier’s e-counting solution.</li></ul></li><li>• This Bulletin seeks your feedback on how, and to what extent, you wish to participate in the User Trials which are scheduled to take place within Pentland House over a three week period commencing on <b>11 January 2016</b>.</li><li>• The 2017 e-count system will essentially be the same system as was used in 2012 and which has been used subsequently for all electronically counted by-elections. For that reason, it is not the intention that the January 2016 User Trials will be a full training session. Over one third of authorities, and indeed 7 out of the 8 largest authorities, have utilised the system for by-elections in the last twelve months. Therefore, many Returning Officers and election teams will already be very familiar with the e-counting system.</li><li>• So, the intention is that the User Trials should allow Council election staff to review the e-counting system, re-familiarise yourselves with it and provide the supplier team with some feedback. We are planning to run the User Trials event each day for 3 weeks from w/c 11 January. The day will likely last from around 10 am to 3.00 pm. The kind of workshop/ presentation sessions which are being considered for inclusion are:</li></ul>

- **Presentation of a small-scale count, demonstrating the operation of the whole e-counting system.**
- **Presentation/ discussion on Reports generated by the system.**
- **Presentation on e-counting Project Timetable and key dates.**
- **Feedback Session.**
- We see the User Trials as being an ideal opportunity for new staff within your core election teams to acquaint themselves with the system. Detailed training on each of the key roles will, however, be provided much nearer the date of the May 2017 election.
- We recognise the competing pressures on ever-declining staff resources, and the potential impact of adverse weather in January, but hope that you will take the opportunity to be represented at the trials. Lunch and other refreshments will be provided. Parking facilities are available.
